PURPOSE

The project seeks to facilitate an enabling environment for improved cross-river interconnection between communities and civil society, and foster social cohesion, by reducing tensions and enhancing mainstreaming of human rights and gender equality in the Transnistrian conflict settlement process.

EXPECTED RESULTS

- Settlement process actors have improved their capacities to integrate human rights and gender equality perspectives in negotiation processes, including a focus on balanced and meaningful participation of women at all levels.
- Civil Society from both banks of the Nistru/Dniester River, human rights structures, and local community actors from the Security Zone have increased capacities to jointly engage in advancing human rights and the 'Women, Peace and Security Agenda'.
- Rights-holders from both banks of the Nistru/Dniester River are better acquainted with human rights and gender equality principles and are enabled to access available public services.
- ✓ Local community actors from the Security Zone implement peace initiatives addressing the grassroots needs and ensure that women's and girls' voices are heard in community planning, decision-making, and throughout peacebuilding processes.
- Civil society organisations, law enforcement and the judiciary have strengthened their capacities to effectively implement international standards in response to hate speech.
- New and traditional media from both banks of the Nistru/Dniester River are empowered to produce evidence-based, human rights, gender- and conflict-sensitive media products to promote tolerance, non-discrimination, and pluralism.
- ✓ Local community actors and school staff from areas with large refugee populations are engaged in community-led prevention and response measures to address and tackle hate speech and discrimination.
- Young women and men from both banks of the Nistru/Dniester River recognise and realise their leadership potential as committed and self-driven peacebuilders within their communities.
