

Towards the realization of [UN Women Moldova Strategic Note 2018 – 2022](#), and following a competitive selection process, UN Women has signed 10 Project Cooperation Agreements (PCAs) with non-governmental organizations from the Republic of Moldova. The NGOs will implement projects in one or more of UN Women's three impact areas: Women's political participation and decision-making; Women's economic empowerment; Ending violence against women.

ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

Artemida is a non-governmental organization in Drochia, established in 1998. Since 2006 it manages a support center for victims of domestic violence. Artemida aims to ensure the promotion and protection of youth, pregnant women, mothers with children, victims of domestic violence by providing alternative reintegration services in order to prevent and combat domestic violence in Moldova. Its support center provides day care services and shelter for victims of domestic violence, as well as psychosocial and legal counseling, professional orientation, medical support, food and hygiene packages.

PROJECT TITLE

"Improved local services for preventing and combating domestic violence"

CONTRIBUTES TO:

UN Women's Strategic Note Output: *Women and girls, especially from excluded groups, have knowledge and skills to exercise their rights to essential services.*

OBJECTIVE

- Improve the essential services provided by multi-disciplinary teams by involving women survivors of domestic violence at local level.

EXPECTED RESULTS AND ACTIVITIES

- 375 women and girls from 15 villages and towns within Drochia district, especially from marginalized groups, gain knowledge about their rights and the available services for preventing and assisting in cases of domestic violence, through personal development workshops, thematic meetings and public events;

- Multidisciplinary teams from 25 villages in Drochia district participate in practical workshops to improve their capacities on case management, including documentation, coordinated and survivor-focused service provision, developing economic empowerment initiatives for women survivors to sustain their economic independence and (re) integration on the labour market;
- Police officers, social assistants, judges, prosecutors and criminal prosecution officers will participate in four round tables to identify the intervention challenges and opportunities to provide protection to the victims of domestic violence and to encourage perpetrators to access reintegration/reeducation programs.
